





ASYLUM AND MIGRATION Facts and Figures

- Increase of asylum application by 490% since 2017. In 2021 the new asylum applications were 13.235 while in 2022, **22.565**.
- The percentage of applicants and holders of any type of international protection status in Cyprus, corresponds to more than 6% of the country's population.
- Over 90% of applications are submitted by migrants entering the country through the Green Line.







STATISTICS

Highest number of first-time asylum applicants relative to the population in Cyprus

- Compared with the population of each EU country, the highest number of registered first-time asylum applicants in 2022 was recorded in **Cyprus** (23.864 first-time applicants per million people), double the number of Austria (11.848) and seven times ahead of Luxembourg (3.711)
- In contrast, the lowest numbers were recorded in Hungary (5 first-time applicants per million people), followed by Slovakia (92) and Czechia (127)
- In 2022, the EU–wide average was 1.973 first-time asylum applicants per million people

First-time asylum applicants relative to the population, 2022



ASYLUM AND MIGRATION Facts and Figures



95% of irregular migrants enter from the occupied territories across the buffer zone (Green Line) into the areas controlled by the Republic of Cyprus, as a result of the instrumentalisation practices adopted by Turkey.

*Specific routes and trends have been identified – use Istanbul airport for transit to travel to the occupied area and then cross the Green Line. In 2023, approximately 72% of irregular migrants who crossed the green line utilized the so-called student visa.

EU policies, instruments and tools.














Engage in productive consultation to tackle the root causes of migration and prevent illegal outflows



OTHER PRIORITIES OF THE NEW GOVERNMENT:

• Creation of a Deputy Ministry of Migration:

Institutionally it will collect under one umbrella the various immigration policies and competent departments for a more effective migration management system

- Faster and more efficient system for examining asylum applications – recruitment of new staff and reinforcement • Strengthening the surveillance along the ceasefire line of the Asylum Service with additional examiners with new technology instruments that can be financed by the EU and through constant surveillance of the line by the patrol guards
- Further enhancement of the judicial process as to minimize the required timeline for the adjudication of cases
- Accelerated voluntary returns and expulsions of non-beneficiaries



Construction and upgrading of Accommodation

Centres: Construction of a new Accommodation Centre and the Pre-departure Center, in the area of "Limnes" in Mennogia and upgrading of the Accommodation Center in Kofinou, in order to be able to accommodate more people

 Conclusion of bilateral agreements with third countries on the return of their own nationals, with emphasis on the need for centralized negotiation on the EU side for the conclusion of corresponding additional return agreements at a higher level









