

**Protocol for the protection of the staff and visitors  
at archaeological sites and museums of the Department of Antiquities  
upon their reopening on June 1<sup>st</sup> 2020**

**1. Implementation of preventive measures in archaeological sites, museums and monuments:**

- Posting written guidelines and information material for the staff regarding how COVID-19 spreads, so that they are familiar with COVID-19 symptoms and be able to recognise them immediately. The aim is for the staff to be able to seek the appropriate medical assistance and laboratory testing and minimise the infection risk of both the visitors and other employees.
- Mandatory dispersion of visitors waiting to enter the archaeological sites and monuments, especially in the case of big groups of visitors and arrangement to accommodate the visitors in smaller groups at different times.
- Posting of posters/guidelines for personal hygiene and signs for keeping the distances in public areas (e.g. in visitors' arrival areas, refreshment stalls, etc.).
- As visitors arrive, whenever it is deemed necessary, it is politely requested that the distance regulations are observed, etc. One person at a time can approach the ticket desk (one for each desk) and the two persons should the appropriate distance. When possible, only one person from a group should approach the ticket desk, pay and receive the tickets of the entire group.
- The presence of a lot of people in indoor areas at the same time should be prevented (1 person / 8 clear m<sup>2</sup>, so that overcrowding is avoided). Find attached an Annex reporting the permitted number of people per area.
- A bottle (with an injection pump and a base) of alcohol-based sanitizer (alcohol content 70%) for hand hygiene should be placed at a visible spot at the entrances and exits of all archaeological sites and monuments, for mandatory use by the visitors. At the spot a sign should be posted with instructions for visitors in Greek and English asking them to disinfect their hands before entering the archaeological site/monument.
- Distribution of the staff into work groups so that there is limited interaction between the groups (e.g. regular changes in shifts).
- Staff at archaeological sites, monuments and museums should mandatorily wear a protective mask and they should either wear gloves or, if they shall not wear gloves, they should apply hand disinfectant before any action requiring change of gloves (see point 3 "guidelines for the staff's personal hygiene" below). Moreover, the staff should strictly care for their personal hygiene.
- Constant supply of sanitary areas with liquid soap, single use hand towels (which should be disposed of in foot-operated bins close to the sinks) and alcohol-based sanitizer (alcohol content 70%). Soap and paper towels dispensers in restrooms should be regularly checked to ensure their proper functioning and should be cleaned regularly.
- Reduction as much as possible of payments in cash and promotion of contactless payments.
- Before starting work, the temperature of the working staff should be checked and in case an individual has fever, they should leave the workplace, after informing the Director of the Department of Antiquities, with instructions to contact their personal doctor immediately.
- Staff that develops COVID-19 symptoms should not come to work and should contact their personal doctor immediately. In case the symptoms present at work, the member of staff should

immediately abandon their work and only return when the symptoms recede and after, in the meantime, mandatorily contacting their personal doctor.

- Persons that are at a higher risk and belong to vulnerable groups, should not carry out tasks that leave them particularly exposed (e.g. at the ticket desks) and in general, they should come into contact with the visitors.

- In case of a confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case, a procedure shall be initiated according to the Ministry of Health document with title “Precautionary measures against the spread of COVID-19 in Workplaces” available at

- Generally, the staff should comply with relevant Orders issued by the Minister of Health.

## **2. Guidelines for the cleaning staff regarding cleaning, disinfection and ventilation**

- Thorough and regular cleaning of common use objects.

- The cleaning staff should receive training on the appropriate cleaning and disinfection procedure regarding coronavirus COVID-19. To this end, the proper documents posted in the unit “Guidelines for precautionary measures to be taken at the workplace” on the Press and Information Office should be used - [https://www.pio.gov.cy/coronavirus/en/pdf/MEASURES\\_AGAINS\\_COVID-19\\_AT\\_WORKPLACES.pdf](https://www.pio.gov.cy/coronavirus/en/pdf/MEASURES_AGAINS_COVID-19_AT_WORKPLACES.pdf)

- Special care should be taken regarding the systematic, sufficient and constant natural ventilation of all areas. All indoor doors and windows should remain open.

- In enclosed areas, the use of air-conditioners or fans is permitted, given that the constant channelling of fresh air is ensured either through mechanical systems or through regular airing out of the area. The maximum number possible of doors and windows in public areas should remain open throughout the time the areas are accessible to visitors. Where a mechanical system is used, it should also operate during the hours the areas are closed for visitors/the staff is not working, or at least for some time beyond the hours that the areas are open for visitors/the staff is working.

- It is understood that regarding the issue of air-conditioning, the terms as they are stated in the Technical Directive regarding the Operation of Air-conditioning / Ventilation Systems (HVAC), prepared by the Department of Labour Inspection, apply, and this is available at: <https://www.pio.gov.cy/coronavirus/en/pdf/erg46.pdf>

- In addition, a more regular maintenance of the air-conditioning systems, filter cleaning and proper operation check should be ensured.

- Particularly regarding ventilation in public indoor restrooms, if possible, where there exists an installed forced ventilation system, forced ventilation in the restrooms 24 hours/day should be ensured and opening the restroom windows should be avoided to achieve the correct direction of the ventilation-aeration. Where there is no forced ventilation system installed, the doors and windows should be open 24 hours/day.

- In restrooms, the use of jet air dryers should be prohibited as their operation could spread droplets in the air.

- All surfaces, floors, counters, cash points, sanitary areas (floors, toilets, sinks, etc.) should be kept clean and disinfected regularly during the day.

- Over and above the usual toilet cleaning procedures, a regular cleaning of the high touch smooth surfaces (e.g. knobs, handles, staircase guards or railings, elevators, switches, faucets, display cases, etc.) with common cleaning products is required, that is liquid soap and water, or chlorine solution 0,1% (liquid chlorine - sodium hypochlorite in 0,1% concentration. In case of chlorine solution which is a 5% sodium hypochlorite solution, the disinfecting solution is a product of a 1:50 dilution) or an alcohol-based sanitizer (alcohol content 70%). It is noted that cleaning tasks should be executed using gloves and a uniform.
- Special attention should be paid to cleaning the objects and surfaces that a person with infection symptoms came into contact with. If necessary, the areas shall be disinfected by a specialised crew.
- The bins' plastic bags, when full, must be tightly tied and removed immediately. After their use, gloves should be disposed of immediately in the disposal bins' plastic bags and not attempt to clean them, e.g. wash single use gloves and reuse them.
- Wheelchairs and golf carts available to accommodate people with disabilities should be disinfected with a proper alcohol-based sanitizer before and after each use.

### **3. Guidelines for the staff's personal hygiene**

- Avoid touching the eyes, nose and mouth with hands to reduce the risk of infection with the virus.
- Avoid talking, coughing or deeply inhaling-exhaling when serving the visitors.
- When coughing or sneezing, cover the nose and mouth with the sleeve or flexed elbow or with a tissue. The used tissue should be disposed of immediately after use in the disposal bins.
- Employees should regularly wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Careful drying of hands with single use paper towels, which should be disposed of in the disposal bins. Hands should necessarily be washed after contact with respiratory secretions and after the use of toilet. It is noted that gloves do not substitute handwashing.
- Individuals with symptoms of a respiratory infection, should not come to work until the symptoms recede and after, in the meantime, mandatorily contacting their personal doctor.
- The staff must wear a mask, following the guidelines hereunder:
  - i. The mask must be of the appropriate type (surgical mask),
  - ii. Must be fitted properly to the face so that it covers both the mouth and nose,
  - iii. Must be changed regularly so that, with time, it does not become a breeding ground for bacteria (staphylococcus, etc.).
  - iv. Must be worn and removed properly, as described in the relevant leaflet of the Ministry of Health and the Press and Information Office, available at: [https://www.pio.gov.cy/coronavirus/pdf/a3\\_mask\\_greek\\_web\\_pio.pdf](https://www.pio.gov.cy/coronavirus/pdf/a3_mask_greek_web_pio.pdf)
- If the staff should wear gloves, they should follow the guidelines hereunder:
  - i. Before wearing the gloves, always wash hands with soap for at least 20 seconds and dry them.
  - ii. Wear the correct size.
  - iii. Change gloves, as often as one would wash hands in case one is not wearing gloves, at least every 4 hours.

- iv. Gloves should be removed each time after the use of the restroom or before eating or handling garbage or cleaning surfaces.
- v. No touching the face while wearing gloves.
- vi. The glove of the hand that shall be used **for monetary transaction must be replaced**.
- vii. Damaged or teared gloves should be replaced immediately.
- viii. Do not reuse gloves already worn. At each change of gloves, the used ones are disposed of.
- ix. Remove each glove separately catching it by the cuff.
- x. Wash hands even when wearing gloves, since infected gloves while being removed can still transmit the virus on the hands.

#### **4. Specific guidelines for visitors' serving areas**

- Regular check should be conducted by the persons designated as responsible per District to control the observance of the precautionary measures both by the staff and the visitors, as well as to guide them.
- Placing signs at entrance points to request visitors not to enter the archaeological sites, museums and monuments if they are feeling unwell or have COVID-19 symptoms.
- In case the ticket desks and shops of the archaeological sites, museums and monuments do not have a protective barrier between the visitor and the antiquities guard, the visitor should keep the greatest distance possible. It is understood that the antiquities guard should wear a mask.
- Employees working at the ticket desks and the shops of the archaeological sites, museums and monuments should wear a protective mask when serving the visitors, and either wear gloves or apply hand sanitizer before each action that requires change of gloves (see point 3 below). Moreover, the staff should strictly care for their personal hygiene.
- It is strictly forbidden for visitors to touch the shops' products.
- Floor markings in the areas where there are cash points (ticket desks, shops) to facilitate compliance with the physical distancing between visitors (two metres).
- Employees serving the public should limit as much as possible any conversations with visitors and restrict themselves to the most essential.
- External visitors are forbidden from entering the office areas (offices, ticket desks, laboratories, etc.).
- At the points of vending machines for food and soft drinks/water, a hand sanitizer station should be installed along with a sign with instructions in Greek and English asking the visitors to disinfect their hands each time before using the coin slot.
